Here is our 1st list. (Not in any particular order)

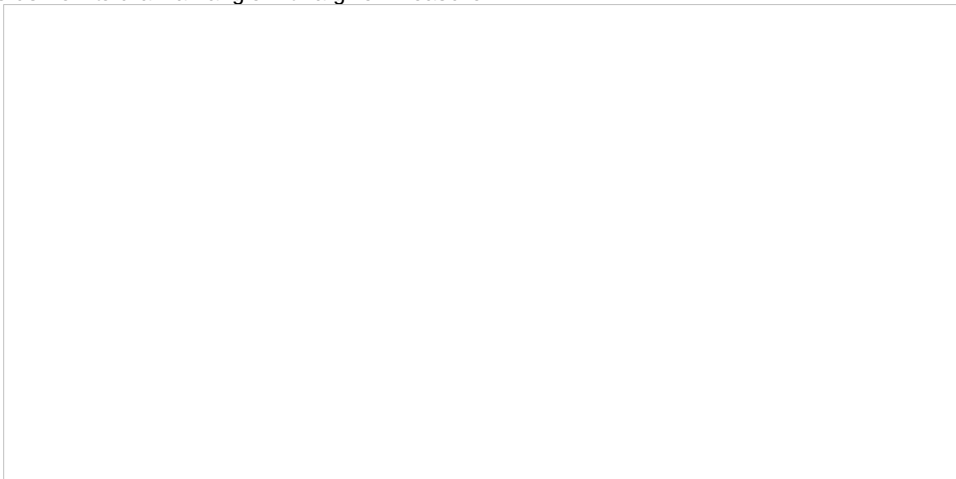
1. A Game for Teaching Adjectives & Adverbs

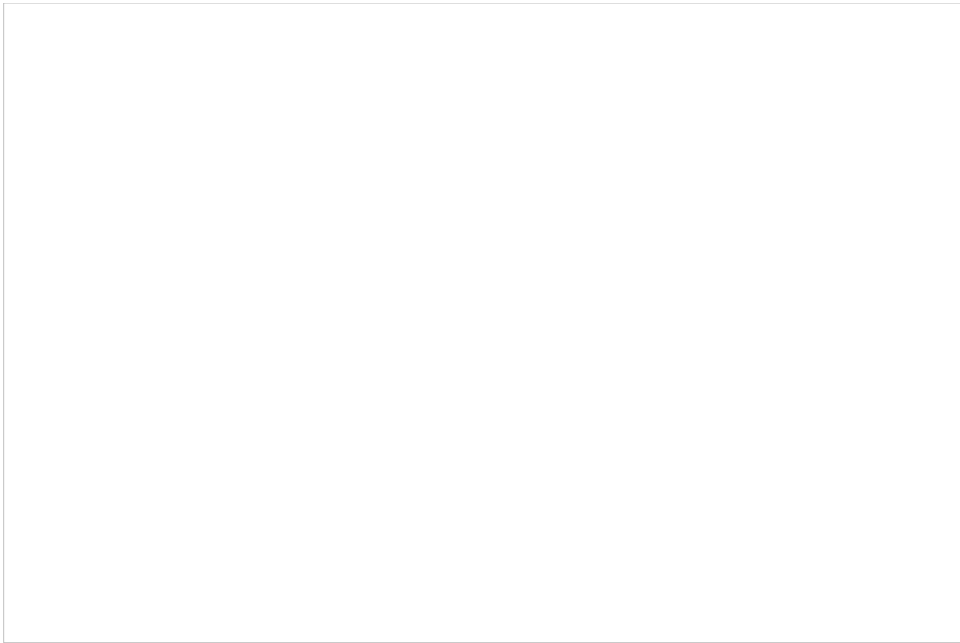
4. Listen, Understand, Act

How good are you in following instructions? Play [this](#) simple game of listening, understanding & acting on a given instruction.



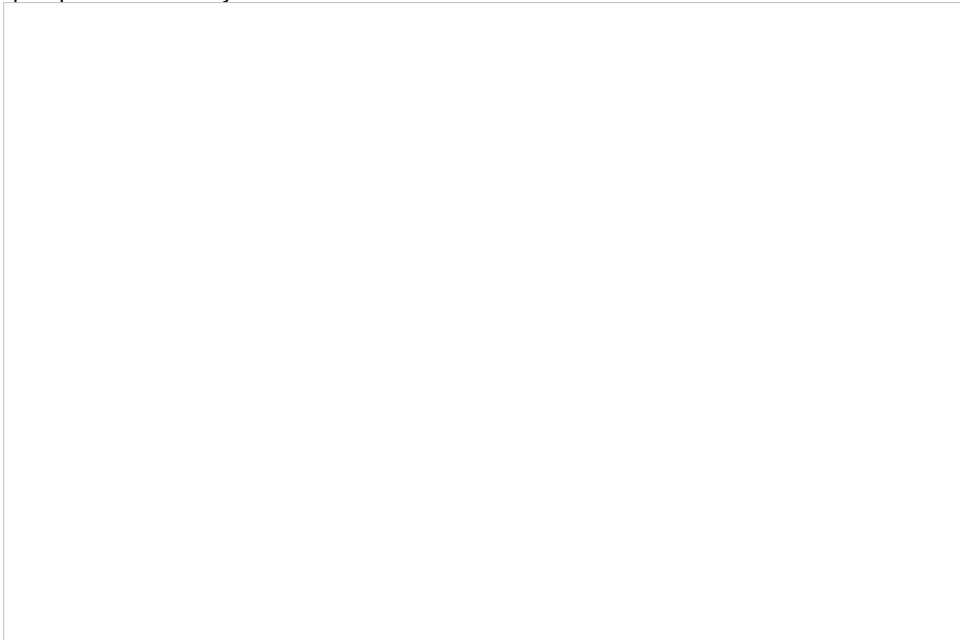
5. What can you do with a string of beads?

Well, [very many things](#). Like addition, subtraction, comparison, HCF, multiplication, division. Check this user manual and discover [more such uses](#).



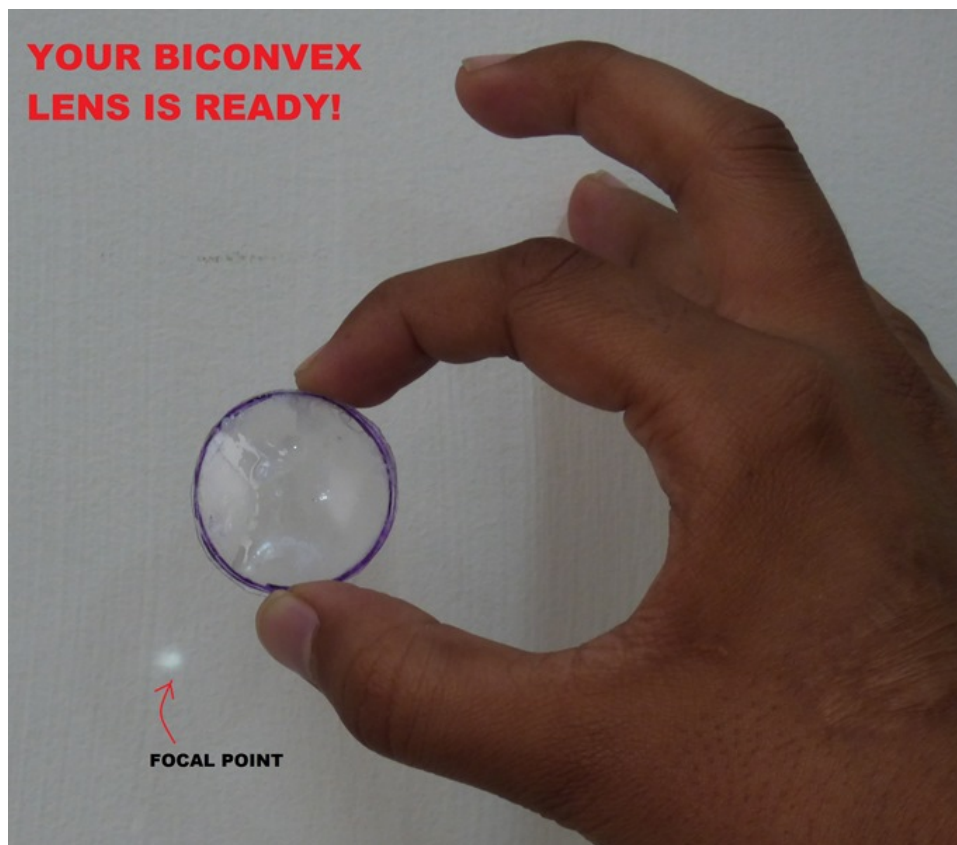
6. The Wall of Questions
